1.	Activity Title	Free Legal and PSS Support for Minorities in Ninawa		
2.	Date	1/1/2018	to	31/5/2018
3.	Location	Ninawa: Mosul District, Hamdaniyah District, Sinjar District, Ba'ashiqa District, and Bartala District.		
4.	Project Description	Free legal and PSS support were given to minority returnees in Mosul District, Hamdaniyah District, Sinjar District, Baashiqa District, and Bartala District. The targeted minorities were comprised of Christians, Yazidis and Shabaks.		
5.	Project Outcomes	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Documenting destruction of properties by using the GIS system. The total number of cases was 27.</li> <li>2. Training returnees and IDPs on their rights. The total number of trainees was 142.</li> <li>3. Distributing copies of a booklet on public rights. The total number of copies was 1787.</li> <li>4. Distributing copies of a booklet on property rights. The total number of copies was 1637.</li> <li>5. Providing free legal services in courts and other governmental institutions. The total number of cases was 378.</li> <li>6. Providing PSS services to returnees and IDPs. The total number of cases was 15 cases.</li> </ol>

1.	Activity Title	Safe Spaces for Women and Children of Mosul		
2.	Date	1/1/2018	to	31/12/2018
3.	Location	Ninawa: Mosul District ( East and West Sides of Mosul).		
4.	Project Description	Six PSS support centers for women and children were opened in Mosul. The project offers PSS, educational support and vocational training. Educational support is provided to all children, especially for children who left schools, and/or for those who were under three years of ISIL occupation. Besides, the project provides literacy programmes for women and teaches them life skills. Group and individual sessions are organized for PSS support and sharing stories. Our teams hold activities that focus on teaching children values that will help them establish a culture of peace, tolerance, cooperation, their human rights and protection of the environment.

1.	Activity Title	Conducting Need Analysis in Ninawa		
2.	Date	14/2/2018	to	15/2/2018
3.	Location	Ninawa: Mosul District, Hamdaniyah District, and Tal' Afar District.		
4.	Project Outcomes	<p>IID team conducted a field assessment of the major needs of the society in three areas in Ninawa, i.e. Mosul District, Hamdaniyah District, and Tal' Afar District on the following topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Agriculture;</li> <li>2. Rapid needs; and</li> <li>3. The market.</li> </ol> <p>Methodology: In each area, 100 semi-structured interviews were carried out, 10 focus group sessions were conducted and 100 questionnaires on agricultural needs, rapid needs and market needs were distributed.</p>		



## Activity 4

1.	Activity Title	TOT Training Course on How to Prepare Studies on Women's Rights Issues and Civil Peace Building		
2.	Date	11/7/2018	to	14/7/2018
3.	Location	Erbil, ChwarChra Hotel		
4.	Project Description	<p>IID organized a training course for TOT trainers for 4 days entitled "Methods of Preparing Studies on Women's Issues and Civil Peace Building". The course targeted 30 women who are involved within Qadirat Team. This team was established by our organization, IID, in 2017 to create initiatives and activities that assist women in Ninawa. The main outcomes are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 30 members of Qadirat team can put a plan to gather information through interviews, designing questionnaire or conducting focus group.</li> <li>• 30 members of Qadirat team can train in any place in Ninawa and give advice on the methods of preparing research and studies.</li> <li>• 30 members of Qadirat team can write professional studies.</li> </ul> <p>We have formed 6 work groups that will work on the preparation of 6 studies on the issues of women in Ninawa from topics that were identified during the training course.</p>

## Activity 5

1.	Activity Title	Establishing Popular Committees in Salah Al-Din		
2.	Date	15/7/2018	to	15/11/2018
3.	Location	Salah Al-Din: Tikreet, Al-Alam and Samaraa		
4.	Project Description	Establishing committees from the security forces and the local community and building their capacity about the concept of police and laws in order to protect people's rights and maintain peace and increase the cooperation between police and society to build civil peace.		
5.	Project Outcomes	<p>- Three raising awareness sessions were organized in Tikrit, Samarra and Al - Alam. 107 participants took part in these sessions. Participants were educated on the importance of forming popular committees. Then, the names of volunteers who were willing to be involved to these committees were registered. They were from civil society organizations, media, Mukhtars and youth volunteers.</p> <p>- Four workshops were organized for two days. 74 volunteers were trained on "The Mechanisms of Communications among the Popular Committees" as well as training the participants on "Types of Communication" that should be achieved between the community, the community police and the security forces. During the workshop, popular committees were established as well as communication mechanisms were determined and all the participants agreed to implement voluntary programmes.</p> <p>- The popular committees that were established from the community, community police and security forces organized 10 lectures in Tikrit, Samarra, and Al-Alam. 473 students from secondary schools participated in these lectures to contribute in spreading the concept of popular committees and how is the process of affiliation to these committees, which will be a link between the society and security institutions.</p>		



## Activity 6

1.	Activity Title	Building Confidence through Dialogue between Security Forces and Society		
2.	Date	15/9/2018	to	15/12/2018
3.	Location	Ninawa: Mosul, Tal'Afar and Bartla		
4.	Project Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Three focus group sessions were held in Mosul, Tal'Afar and Bartla. In each session, 15 participants took part and they were from the power movers in the society and commanders of the security forces in the three regions. The discussion was about the problems experienced by the community to communicate with the security forces and to clarify the ways to increase trust between the two parties.</li> <li>- Three sessions were conducted in Mosul, Tal'Afar and Bartla. 240 power mover figures from those areas participated in these sessions. The discussion concentrated on the importance of increasing the rapport between security forces and the society and what are the reasons of non-cooperation of the society with the security forces.</li> <li>- Fifteen lectures were organized on the role of society in cooperation with the security forces in achieving the stability of society and the role of youth in supporting security through communication with the security forces and the community police in Ninawa.</li> </ul>

Activity Description	<p>The main objective of this component (Human Capacity Development) is to engage various implementing partners and coordinating bodies in a sustainable exit strategy that would take into account all the measures implemented by GIZ in the CFW program in KRI.</p> <p>Activities/ Training:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Supply Chain: 12 days training – 4 days per governorate: November 2018 – 44 attendees</li> <li>2. Human Resources: 2 days: Dec 2018 – 23 attendees</li> <li>3. Finance: 2 days: Dec 2018 – 23 attendees</li> <li>4. Monitoring &amp; Evaluation: 2 days: Dec 2018 – 20 attendees</li> <li>5. Project Cycle: 2 days – 27 attendees</li> <li>6. ## Activity 8

1.	Activity Title	For a Clean Environment from Mines		
2.	Date	25/12/2018	to	26/12/2018
3.	Location	Ninawa Governorate, Mosul City, Hall of the Preparation and Training Section that is a part of Ninawa General Directorate of Education		
4.	Project Description	<p>Because of the spread of mines in Mosul, planted by ISIL in the residential areas in the city, especially in the Right Side and the escalating number of injuries, especially children and the elderly, and their lack of the needed awareness about the dangers of those mines located in landfills and the Old City, IID held a workshop to train educators about this lethal hazard in cooperation with the Demining Directorate, the Iraqi Ministry of the Interior. Twenty-five school principals and teachers from West Mosul participated in order to raise their awareness about the types of mines, prevention methods and how to report and to whom. After the workshop, the principals and teachers raised the awareness and educated 2500 students in their schools about the danger of IEDs and mines. To help them in their effort, IID printed 2 x 2 m posters to distribute them in 30 schools in targeted mine-contaminated areas.</p>

2.	Date	12/2/2018	to	14/2/2018
3.	Location	Kuwait State		
4.	Conference Description	At the invitation of the Reconstruction Fund for Iraq's Affected Areas (REFAATO), IID participated in the high-level expert meeting at the Kuwait International Conference. A documentary movie was shown on the problem of post-ISIL education and traumatized people. Also, the intervention methods to mitigate the problem of violent extremism, violence culture, and education. One can say children and women are the most affected people due to the three-year occupation of ISIL over the city of Mosul.
