5	Project Description:	<p>To heal the community from ISIL and war effects, IID from the first moment has started providing PSS and catch up classes to the people of Mosul. Once liberated in 2017, IID has opened six centers in East and West Mosul evenly. In 2018 and due to shortage of funding, the centers were reduced into only three and employees who have gained excellent practical experience were downsized, more clearly two centers in West Mosul and only one in the East. The centers provide PSS to children and women and offer advice to every one seeks it in almost every aspect of life. Also, we have started using these centers as a basis for peace building, spreading the culture of tolerance and help to resolve conflicts and building social cohesion. Besides all aforementioned services, the centers provide educational classes to children and literacy classes to women with some important life skills. Different educational group sessions are provided to exchange experiences and knowledge. Our staff is concentrating its efforts to teach children values that help them promote the culture of peace, citizenship, cooperation, human rights respect and protection of the environment.</p>

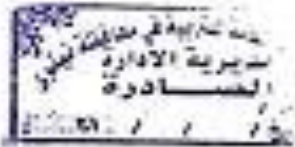

The outcome of the training was proofreading and rewriting FIVE studies conducted by Mosuli women activists in the following topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Electronic Blackmail of Women: A Case Study (Mosul District). 2. The Effect of Social Cohesion in Mosul. 3. Uncontrolled Arms: Dangers and Challenges. 4. Girls' Refusal to Go to School. 5. "Constraints and Needs of Yazidi's Women ‘Survivors of ISIL’”.

5	Project Description:	<p>Mosul went through the largest urban conflict since WWII and suffered a lot. The consequences of ISIL occupation and the fighting to liberate it created further suffering. ISIL seized control of most of Ninawa Governorate for more than three years. During ISIL control, ISIL targeted education to instill their extremist ideology and violence into children's mind. To achieve the goals, ISIL forced teachers to teach ISIL curricula. The curricula were manipulated and changed to serve ISIL goals. To fight these ideas and eliminate its negative effects, IID in cooperation and coordination with the Iraqi Ministry of Education and the Ninawa General Education Directorate implemented "Preventing Violent Extremism through Government Primary Schools in Mosul" programme, which was designed and adapted to fit the culture and social environment of Mosul. Also, to reduce and eliminate extremist behaviour and violent ideas from teachers and children through applying the informal training programme to promote the positive values of society and their school by implementing modern activities and curricula related to the spirit of tolerance and cooperation, building peace, critical thinking, citizenship education, rejecting violence and encouraging them to create sessions that express themselves and show their needs.</p>

5	Project Description:	<p>IID organized a conference in Mosul entitled “Badeena for Dialogue and Reconstruction”, which aimed to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. promote dialogue between society and the local government; 2. strengthen the networking and partnership process between government institutions and civil society; 3. identify the problems that get in the way of the construction process in Ninawa Governorate; 4. identify and name the most important sectors that must be targeted and they are: Health services, roads and bridges, water supply projects and environment. Two years after Mosul liberation from ISIL, and the problems are the same and escalating. 100 people from the local government, civil society organizations, tribal leaders and influential figures participated in the conference. The activity came out with a number of recommendations to the local government in order to develop an action plan on the priorities that must be worked on the long and short term. Also, the civil society should engage in it due to its knowledge of society needs and its ability to draw policy according to its needs.

5	Project Description:	<p>IID presented 5 plays in order to encourage dropout students to return to schools, in each play, two different presentations were made on different issues that were taken from real life and as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The first play entitled 'The Will', which simulates the story of a poor family whose children left school, but the mother urged her children to return to study according to the will of their passed father. The events revolve around children who meet people who negatively influence their education and attempt to make them leave school, but with the perseverance of the mother and her persistence, she successfully leads the family to safe shore despite the deteriorated bad economic situation of the family. 2. The second play entitled "The Land of Lazy People", which talks about a family of 3 children in school and at the beginning of the new school year, the old boy pretended that he is sick. Next, an imaginal character comes and asks the boy about why he is not in school? He replied that it is a holiday. The man said that he is a liar and he would take him to the land of lazy people where dropouts meet, punished, regret, and scream. The character tells the boy that this is his future if he keeps lying, and then he wakes up and it turns out to be a merely dream. At the end, he and his brothers return to school.

5	Project Description:	<p>IID implemented the "My Education, My Right(s)" project, which called to improve education in Iraq and establish a network between NGOs and the Iraqi government to identify needs through rehabilitating organizations that work on education and help to organize advocacy campaigns. Activities were as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Two-day workshop was conducted in Erbil from 26 to 27/4/2019 on "Methods of Writing Shadow Report on SDG4". The participation of one of IID members in the ECOSOC and submitting a shadow report on SDG4 which was held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York, USA on 9/7/2019 until 18/7/2019. Coinciding with the Global Action Week (GCE), from 25/4/2019 to 1/5/2019, IID organized 4 conferences in Iraq, i.e. Mosul, Baghdad, Diyala and Basra that aimed to raise the issue of government accountability for education and raise the questions of education reality in the Iraqi Governorates. Also, to identify the basic needs of education and how could be met. Two-day workshop was conducted in Erbil from 27 to 28/12/2019 on "Establishing an Education Network in Iraq". Ten organizations from different Iraqi governorates participated in the workshop to establish a network that aims to concentrate and unify Iraqi organizations efforts that working in the field of education in order to claim a quality, inclusive and free education in Iraq.

5	Project Description:	IID held a symposium to talk about the fourth and fifth bridges in Mosul. The purpose of the symposium was to introduce the importance of these bridges in the development and reconstruction of Ninawa to the (World Bank). Also, the importance of speeding up the process of rebuilding them for the reconstruction of the city, especially the West. It is known that Mosul has 5 main bridges, all of them were destroyed during liberation, only one bridge had been reconstructed, and other four bridges are on hold. Sixty people attended the symposium from Ninawa Governorate, service offices, NGOs, media, and public figures.

5	Project Description:	IID has implemented a workshop entitled “The Role of Youth in Achieving National Reconciliation and Civil Peace in Ninawa”. The purpose of the workshop was to train young people in the mechanisms of conflict resolution and peace building in the society after ISIL. The participants drew a map of conflicts in Ninawa that resulted from ISIL occupation of the governorate for more than three years and what are the priorities that must be worked on in the short and long term. 25 young men and women from both sexes and from different religions and ethnicities got involved in the workshop.
